



DAY 1

Enjoy the ride and hopefully the beautiful fall colors as we travel east to our first overnight in London, Ontario, Canada, or Elyria, OH. A welcome dinner has been included for you this evening. (D)

DAY 2

After breakfast we will depart for Lake Champlain. We will arrive at the Basin Harbor Resort in the late afternoon. Enjoy a one-hour welcome reception with beer, wine, and soft drinks. Dinner is served in the main inn (three courses with 4 entrée selections). (B, D)

DAY 3

After a deluxe country breakfast, depart with your local guide for a full day of touring to include:

Shipwrecks Cruise: Explore and discover the incredibly well-preserved 1800's wooden shipwrecks that lie on the bottom of Lake Champlain. They deploy an ROV (remotely operated vehicle) and by viewing screens onboard the boat, you will be part of the exploration of the wreck from the surface. Your guide will not only give you information about the wreck, but

also a rich narrative history of Lake Champlain.

Vermont Teddy Bear: Enjoy a guided tour of the factory with time to shop in the Bear gift store.

Historic Church ST Marketplace: Lunch and shopping on your own in this pedestrian walkway filled with bistros, boutiques, and street vendors/performers.

Shelburne Vineyards: In 1998, after many years as an IBM engineer working on computer chips, and growing grapes in his back yard, Ken (manager, grower, and winemaker) made the jump to full-time, commercial scale grape growing and winemaking. With more than 20 years of experience crafting award-winning wines first in Washington State and now in Vermont, Scott (winemaker, strategic planner) collected awards in wine competitions that include Best of Show, Double Gold, Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals. They planted their first vines in 1998; had their first harvest in the fall of 2000; and the wines were first released to the public in August of 2001. They have maintained organic certification by NOFA-VT since 2000. The new Winery/Tasting Room on Rt. 7 opened in December 2007, and is a fantastic addition to tours.

Return to Basin Harbor Club for a special outdoor dinner (weather dependant) and a history talk with Bob Beach, owner of Basin Harbor. (B, D)

DAY 4

After breakfast, depart with your guide for another full day of touring to include:

Ben & Jerry's: A guided tour of the ice cream factory is your first stop this morning where you will learn how two high school friends became entrepreneurs in the ice cream industry.

Quechee Gorge: Vermont's little grand canyon for spectacular views!

Woodstock, VT: Described as the quintessential New England town by Ladies Home Journal, enjoy free time for lunch and shopping.

Billings Farm and Museum:

Considered the gateway to Vermont's rural heritage; the Billings Farm and Museum is known as one of the finest Jersey dairy farms in America, and is devoted to telling the story of Vermont's rural past. Visit the 1890 farm house and engaging farm life exhibits. Our guide will have shown you their 30 minute movie en route so that your time here can be spent exploring the farm. This movie has won numerous awards.

Long Trail Brewery: Visit VT's most famous micro brewer.

Enjoy an included dinner en route back to the Basin Harbor Club. (B, D)



DAY 5

After a full breakfast, bid a sad farewell to the Basin Harbor Club and begin your journey towards New Hampshire. your final stop in Vermont is at **Rock of Ages**, a 600' deep granite quarry which is truly an amazing site. A local guide from the quarry will get on board the coach and bring you right up to the quarry where the history and longevity will be explained. Travel to **Franconia Notch State Park** and enjoy an included boxed lunch as you travel. Upon arrival at this magnificent state park, an enclosed aerial tram ride to the top of Cannon MT is included for 360 degree fall foliage views. Travel the famed **Kancamangus Highway**, a federally funded scenic byway with spectacular scenery to **North Conway**, your home for one night. Dinner is included. **(B, D)**

DAY 6

After breakfast, depart for NH's Lake Region. Visit **Holderness, NH** for a **narrated scenic boat cruise on Squam Lake**, the setting for the movie, *On Golden Pond*. Hear amusing stories from the locals about the filming of the movie; see the home where Katherine Hepburn and Henry Fonda lived, plus view the rocky area where Henry went overboard and almost drowned. In addition, enjoy the peaceful, tranquil waters and hopefully you will spot some loons as Squam Lake is home to many of these birds. Lunch is on your own in Meredith, NH, overlooking Lake Winnepesaukee. Continue to **Wells, ME** and your Hampton Inn for a two night stay. Dinner is an **authentic lobster clam-bake** with all the fixins plus some real downeast Maine hospitality. **(B, L, D)**

DAY 7

After a deluxe Hampton Inn breakfast, meet your local guide and depart for a full day of touring. A **two-hour locally guided tour of Kennebunkport** is first on the agenda, to include the Wedding Cake House, Ocean Drive, picture stop at former President Bush's cottage, Cape Porpoise, and so much more! Free time will be in **Dock Square**, filled with unique boutiques and bistros for lunch and shopping on your own. This afternoon, enjoy a **narrated and scenic lobster boat ride** to learn about the challenging life of a lobster fisherman. This excursion also gives you the opportunity to view some of the summer cottages only visible from the water. Enjoy some free time in Perkin's Cove before heading towards **Sturbridge, MA** with an included "Yankee" dinner at the Public House and an over night at the Host Hotel. **(B, D)**

DAY 8

After a full breakfast, begin your journey west. We'll make a stop in Syracuse, NY at the **Erie Canal Museum** which is housed in the 1850 Weighlock Building where canal boats were weighed during the days when they traveled through the center of Syracuse on the Erie Canal. A gallery full of participatory exhibits gives visitors a look at canal life and promotes hands-on-learning. You'll see a life size line boat and get an introduction to the salt industry in Syracuse. Continuing west we'll overnight in Erie, PA and enjoy a farewell dinner. **(B, D)**

DAY 9

After enjoying your breakfast, we will depart for home, returning to Wisconsin with wonderful memories of our time in New England. **(B)**
